Faith, trust and filial abandonment was the pulse of his spiritual life and he learned to perceive the Hand of God in every event of his life. Fr. Calabria was deeply concerned with the personal sanctity of each and every individual, "Be Living Gospels" was his untiring words to his confreres. At the foot of the Crucifix, Fr. Calabria wrote the first and fundamental rule of the congregation, he wrote that, "the *fundamental Rule of the Congregation of the Poor Servants of the Divine Providence is the person of Jesus Christ as revealed to us from the whole Gospel*". His deep faith in the paternity of God extended with a special concern to those who were poor, marginalized, abandoned, sick, old, rejected, addicted and suffering brothers and sisters of the society. Fr. Calabria constantly reminded his confreres of the importance of reaching out to the poor in the society. "He wrote to Don Stanislaus: "Go in search for the souls: the abandoned creatures, sinners, old people, poor, sick, the desperate.
